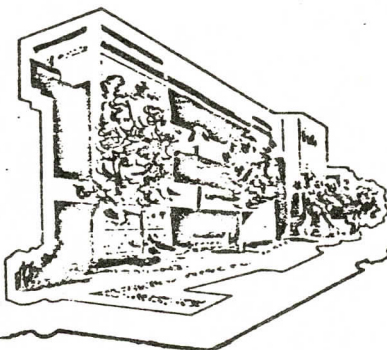

"TRIAL BY JURY" — The Story

The Defendant, tiring of his betrothed, falls in love with another girl. The jilted fiancée promptly hails him into court for breach of promise. As the action begins, the Usher admonishes the Jury that "from bias free of every kind this trial must be tried" and proceeds to show a distinct partiality himself the moment the lovely Plaintiff appears. The Defendant, meanwhile, contends that his only offense was to fall in love with another girl. Though both Judge and Jury have done much the same thing when they were young, they have little sympathy for the Defendant. The Plaintiff has clearly captivated all the men, while the ladies present are quite partial to the Defendant. The Plaintiff's Counsel gives a stirring speech. The Defendant pleads his own case, and proposes to marry his old sweetheart today if he may marry his new one tomorrow. The Plaintiff's Counsel naturally objects. The Defendant then claims to be a drunkard who would beat and kick her, hoping to dissuade her from insisting upon marriage. The Learned Judge proposes that the Defendant be made drunk to test him. The Plaintiff and her Counsel violently object. Finally, the Judge who is anxious to get away, solves the case by marrying the lady himself.

THE SAVOYARDS

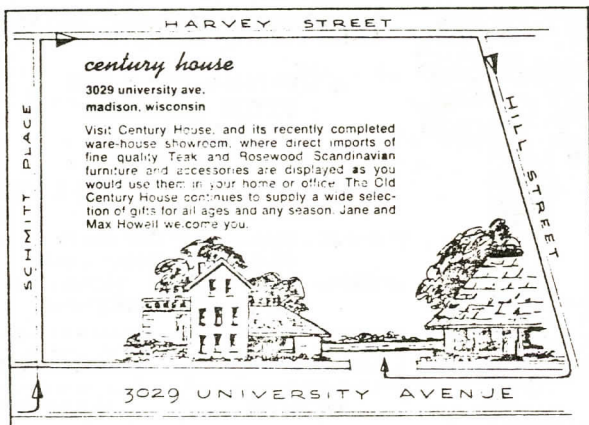
The London Savoy Theatre was built on the tremendous proceeds from the Gilbert and Sullivan operas by their business manager, impresario Richard D'Oyly Carte. The theater was built in 1881 expressly to produce the Gilbert and Sullivan operas and true to the director's wishes to have the finest technical theater available, it was the first electrically lit theater in the world. The 14 Gilbert and Sullivan operas are therefore known as the "Savoy Operas" and a devotee of these operas is called a "Savoyard."

The Madison Savoyards was founded in 1962 by a group of high school students who were ardent Gilbert and Sullivan fans. The group has grown from humble beginnings of unaccompanied sing-throughs in church basements to full scale productions with the Madison Chamber Orchestra in the Wisconsin Union Theater. This season Savoyards will present "Ruddigore, or The Witch's Curse" July 21, 22, 23, 28, 29 under the direction of Ronald A. Mitchell and David Crosby. 

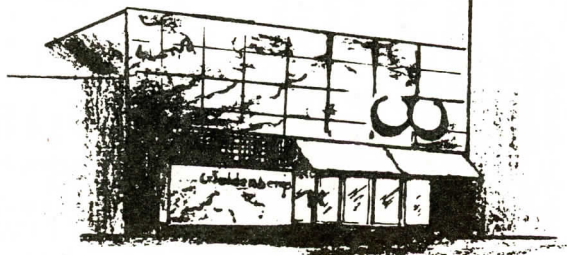

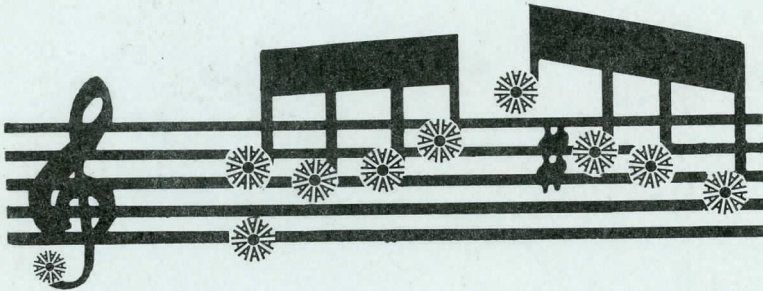
